Return to Play Policies and Procedures

September to December Programs - 2020

- 1. All skaters, parents/guardians, and coaches are asked to carefully review the Skate Ontario Return-to-Play policy documents.
- 2. All participants completed the Skate Ontario COVID-19 Waiver during the registration process.
- 3. Skaters will be asked verbal health screening questions prior to entering the arena area.

BEFORE ARRIVING FOR YOUR SESSION

- 1. Ensure you have all your skating equipment including: skates, guards, gloves, and anything else you will need water bottle, tissues (and bag for disposal), hand sanitizer and facemask.
- 2. Review the <u>Health Screening Questionnaire</u> if you answer yes to any of the questions, DO NOT go to the rink.
- 3. Make sure you are arriving for your scheduled session only. Skaters/coaches will only be admitted to the facility based on the session(s) they have registered for in advance.
- 4. You will be permitted to have 1 small bag for your belongings.

ACCESS TO CASSIE CAMPBELL COMMUNITY CENTRE

A detailed traffic flow policy has been implemented at Cassie Campbell Community Centre to prevent overlap of groups and contact with other facility users. Arena users will have their own dedicated entrance and exit that is separate from other rental groups in the facility.

Building Entrance and Exit

The only entrance for arena users will be the West entrance beside the police station as noted on the map below. All skaters and coaches must enter through this door. There is a parking circle for skater drop off and pickup.

Individuals may enter the building no earlier than 10min prior to their scheduled start time.

Washrooms

- Skaters and coaches will have access to the washrooms which are between arena A and B.
- Spectators will have access to the public washroom near the community rooms.


Personal Protective Equipment

Peel Public Health requires use of non-medical masks in public buildings unless exempt by due to medical reasons. All individuals must wear a face covering when entering and exiting the facility. Masks may be removed by coaches and athletes for the duration of their on-ice session. Skaters are highly encouraged to wear skating gloves. Spectators are asked to wear face masks in the viewing area.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE AT CASSIE CAMPBELL COMMUNITY CENTRE

- 1. Skaters may use outside areas for warmup if required.
- 2. You will be permitted entrance to the facility 10 minutes before your scheduled ice time. Please enter through the West entrance beside the Police Station.
- 3. Please sanitize your hands upon entry to the building with sanitizer provided.
- 4. Masks are mandatory in the building except for skaters and coaches while they are ON the ice. Parents and spectators are asked to keep their masks ON at all times.
- 5. Parent are asked to drop their skaters off at the sliding door entrance to the arena pad they are scheduled to skate on. A volunteer or SCBC board member will check in skaters at these entrances and will also accompany them back for pickup at the conclusion of the session.

Changing Areas

Skaters are encouraged to arrive "skate ready" fully dressed and with skates on if possible. There will be limited access to changerooms on site. There will be **three** (3) designated areas for skaters to put on / take off their skates if they require to do so at the facility:

- 1. Designated chairs outside of the building entrance.
- 2. Two assigned dressing rooms per session are available. Skaters must check with session rep for dressing room assignments. Skaters are asked to practice social distancing and wear a face mask at all times while in the dressing room.
- 3. Chairs and benches will also be available just inside each arena entrance.

As there are no rubber mats in the outdoor changing area or lobby of the facility, a pair of hard skate guards will be required by all skaters if arriving with your skates on or using the outdoor changing area. You can purchase these at any figure skating store or sports store:

Skater Check-In

Parents are asked to drop their skaters off at the sliding door entrance to the arena pad they are scheduled to skate on. A volunteer or SCBC board member will check in skaters at these entrances and will also accompany them back for pickup at the conclusion of the session.

DURING YOUR SESSION

- 1. Please remained spaced at least 2m apart when lining up to enter the ice.
- 2. Please ensure your water bottles and personal belongings are spaced out on the boards at least 2m from other skaters belongings.
- 3. Masks are required in the building but not on the ice for skaters
- 4. Please dispose of any used tissues after use you are responsible for providing your own tissues and bag for disposal. Tissues must not be left around the boards or players benches.

Spectators

One parent or guardian per athlete will be permitted into the building. There will be a standing room only viewing area on the second floor above the stands. Please note the stands are CLOSED to access at this time. A limited number of chairs will be available in accessible seating for those who require a seat. Spectators are asked to practice social distancing and keep their masks on at all times.

WHEN YOUR SESSION IS OVER

- 1. Line up at least 2m apart when exiting the ice and take all your belongings with you.
- 2. Proceed to the same designated area to take your skates off or put your skate guards on and exit the building.
- 3. Exit the building immediately.
- 4. Parents/guardians are asked to avoid lingering in the lobby. We encourage you to socialize with one another outside the building.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

It is encouraged that limited personal belongings be brought into the facility. Skaters are asked to bring with them only their skates and items required for training. A personal tissue box, pre-filled water bottle gloves, and hard guards are acceptable items. A small bag may be used if required. There will be a designated area for skaters to leave their belongings and shoes at rink side.

In order to maintain a clean and hygienic environment, there will be no lost and found available at CCCC or in the SCBC club office this fall/winter. Any personal items that are left behind will be disposed of. Skaters are asked to take extra care to ensure they are leaving with all items that they arrived with.

AS A REMINDER

- 1. Skaters are asked to wear clean clothes every day.
- 2. Please wash and sanitize your hands frequently.
- 3. Skaters (and spectators) are reminded to practice social distancing and maintain a distance of 2 metres apart at all times.
- 4. Anyone (skater or parent) who are showing any symptoms listed on the daily health questionnaire are asked to stay home.
