GENERAL INFORMATION

DEADLINE

Registration opens on Monday, March 27th at 9:00am. Closing time for registration: Friday, April 7th, 2022 at 11:59pm. Online registration will be available on <u>www.skatescbc.ca</u>.

ENTRY FEES

- \$50.00 per skater for first category (includes freeskate, dance, and elements)
- \$25.00 per skater for any additional category (as above)

Please note that the committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries in each category; categories will be filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. Based on the numbers of registrations for any given category, the committee reserves the right to cancel that category. Specifically, any category with only one entry will be cancelled. If there is extra time, an exhibition may be offered.

REFUNDS AND WITHDRAWALS

Full refunds will be given for any cancelled category, or if the entry is withdrawn prior to the closing date. After the closing date, refunds will only be given for medical reasons if the Club office is contacted prior to 9am on May 5th, and the registrar receives a medical certificate.

REGISTRATION

On competition day, all competitors must register no later than one hour prior to the scheduled start of their category.

MUSIC REGISTRATION

For the 2023 SCBC Star 1-4 Club Competition, competitors must submit their music online through Google Forms. Link will be available following registration closing.

Music registration must by uploaded through Google Forms by 11:59 PM EST on April 28th. Note: You will need a Gmail account to compete the music registration form.

MARKING SYSTEM

The Skate to Standard marking system will be used at this event.

AWARDS

Medals will be presented to skaters finishing first, second, and third in each of the following categories:

- STAR 4 freeskate
- STAR 4 individual elements

Ribbons will be presented to all participants in the following categories:

- STAR 1 3 freeskate
- Star 1 3 elements
- Star 2/3 solo dance
- Showcase 1 2

Awards will be presented periodically throughout the day. Times will be posted in the lobby.

ELIGIBILITY

Competitors must be home club members of Skate Canada Brampton-Chinguacousy.

ASSESSMENT QUALIFICATIONS

As of January 1st, 2023.

Incomplete entries will not be accepted.

CATEGORIES

STARSKATE CATEGORIES

All Freeskate categories from Star 1 – 4 will be judged using the 2022-2023 Skate Canada – Well Balanced Program (WBP) technical package posted at:

These categories are open to those skaters who do not meet the criteria for the Adult Classifications.

FREESKATE CATEGORIES

Skaters are only permitted to enter one freeskate category.

STAR 2 Free Skating Program (Compulsory Assessment Program) - Assess to Standard

- May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 (Senior Bronze) Free Skating Assessment
- Individual elements plus Skating Skills and Performance assessed to standard
- Skaters may be grouped by age if numbers warrant.
- Program length: 2:10 minutes in length maximum
- No age restrictions.

STAR 3 Free Skating Program – Assess to Standard

- May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 (Senior Bronze) Free Skating Assessment
- One program of 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- Individual elements plus Skating Skills, Performance, and Interpretation assessed to standard. Skaters may be grouped by age if numbers warrant.
- No age restrictions.

STAR 4 Free Skating Program - Assess to Standard & Ranked

- May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 (Senior Bronze) Free Skating Assessment
- One program of 2:00 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- Individual elements plus Skating Skills, Performance, and Interpretation assessed to standard and ranked
- Skaters may be grouped by age if numbers warrant.

INDIVIDUAL ELEMENTS

Elements Categories are an opportunity for skaters to perform free skate elements in a competition format without the constraints of a performance or musical interpretation associated with the use of music. Skaters are able to focus on proper technique and quality while challenging themselves to attempt more difficult elements.

Element categories consist of progressive levels beginning at STAR 2 up to Gold. Entry for Element categories is consistent with Freeskate categories and skaters may skate up one level if they choose.

Procedures for individual elements categories:

- Each skater will perform four elements in isolation in the order listed for their level of competition
- Each element may only be attempted once
- All skaters will perform Element #1 before performing Element #2 and so on, until all four elements have been executed by all skaters
- Spins will not be assigned levels and will be assessed on quality only
- STAR 2 to STAR 4 events will use half-ice to perform the elements

STAR 1 Elements Assessment - Assess to Standard

- May not have passed any part of the STAR 6 (Senior Bronze) Free Skating Assessment
- Elements assessed to standard (Gold, Silver, or Bronze)
- Skaters may be grouped by age if numbers warrant; No age restrictions.
- Eight elements:
 - Circle Stroking Exercise: Stroking (Crosscuts) in same direction on a circle (one round forward, one round backward); draw for direction
 - Waltz Jump
 - Single Salchow
 - Single Toe loop
 - Forward Upright Spin
 - Backward Upright Spin
 - Forward Spiral circles: Two Spirals, one on each foot executed on a circle in the same direction; skater chooses direction
 - Creative Expression routine (30 seconds music provided by the Section, selection randomly chosen at competition – each flight to have a different music selection). This is assessed as "completed" or "incomplete" only.

STAR 2 Elements – Assess to standard

- Element #1 Single Loop Jump
- Element #2 Waltz Jump + single Toe Loop Jump Combination
- Element #3 backward Upright Spin; minimum three revolutions
- Element #4 forward Spiral Sequence two forward Spirals, one on each foot performed on either outside or inside Edges; no more than eight steps between; both Spirals must be unassisted

STAR 3 Elements – Assess to standard

- Element #1 Single Flip Jump
- Element #2 Single Loop + single Loop Jump Combination
- Element #3 Combination Spin forward entry only; must include at least one Camel Position and one Sit Position; change of foot optional; no flying entry; no difficult variations; minimum of four revolutions or minimum of three revolutions on each foot if executing change of foot
- Element #4 forward Spiral Sequence two forward Spirals, one on each foot performed on either outside or inside Edges; no more than four Steps between; both Spirals must be unassisted

STAR 4 Elements - Assess to standard with ranking

- Element #1 single Axel
- Element #2 single Lutz + single Loop Jump Combination
- Element #3 Combination Spin forward entry only; must include at least one Camel Position and one Sit Position; change of foot optional; no flying entry; no difficult variations; minimum of four revolutions or minimum of three revolutions on each foot if executing change of foot
- Element #4 forward Spiral Sequence two forward Spirals, one on each foot performed on either outside or inside Edges; no more than four Steps between; both Spirals must be unassisted

SOLO DANCE

The following categories are open to those skaters who do not meet the criteria for the Adult Classifications. Please check with your Coach to see what level your skater is at. Limit to one dance per skater. Skate Canada series 8 music will be used, unless otherwise specified.

STAR 2/3 Dance – Canasta Tango (2 Sequences) – Assess to Standard

Skaters will have passed the STAR 1 dance test, but not the complete Star 3 Dance assessment.

SHOWCASE

The following categories are open to those skaters who do not meet the criteria for the Adult Classifications. Please check with your Coach to see what level your skater is at. Limit to one showcase per skater. Skate Canada series 8 music will be used, unless otherwise specified.

Showcase 1

- Assessment: Must have passed the STAR 1 Skills assessment
- One program to music a maximum of one minute in length
- Three Program Components will be assessed to standard: Skating Skills, Performance and Interpretation

Showcase 2

- Assessment: Must have passed the STAR 4 Skills assessment but no higher than the STAR 6 freeskate assessment
- One program to music a maximum of one minute 30 seconds in length
- Three Program Components will be assessed to standard: Skating Skills, Performance and Interpretation
